Your vote is important

The business of the Meeting affects your shareholding and your vote is important.

Voting eligibility

The Directors have determined pursuant to Regulation 7.11.37 of the Corporations Regulations 2001 (Cth) that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered Shareholders at 11:00am EST on 28 May 2018.

Voting in person

To vote in person, attend the Meeting at the time, date and place set out above.

Voting by proxy

To vote by proxy, please complete and sign the enclosed Proxy Form and return by the time and in accordance with the instructions set out on the Proxy Form.

In accordance with section 249L of the Corporations Act, Shareholders are advised that:

- each Shareholder has a right to appoint a proxy;
- the proxy need not be a Shareholder of the Company; and
- a Shareholder who is entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If the member appoints two proxies and the appointment does not specify the proportion or number of the member's votes, then in accordance with section 249X(3) of the Corporations Act, each proxy may exercise one-half of the votes.

Shareholders and their proxies should be aware that changes to the Corporations Act made in 2011 mean that:

- if proxy holders vote, they must cast all directed proxies as directed; and

- any directed proxies which are not voted will automatically default to the Chair, who must vote the proxies as directed.

Further details on these changes are set out below.

Proxy vote if appointment specifies way to vote

Section 250BB(1) of the Corporations Act provides that an appointment of a proxy may specify the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution and, **if it does**:

- the proxy need not vote on a show of hands, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (ie as directed); and
- if the proxy has two or more appointments that specify different ways to vote on the resolution, the proxy must not vote on a show of hands; and
- if the proxy is the chair of the meeting at which the resolution is voted on, the proxy must vote on a poll, and must vote that way (ie as directed); and
- if the proxy is not the chair, the proxy need not vote on the poll, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (ie as directed).

Transfer of non-chair proxy to chair in certain circumstances

Section 250BC of the Corporations Act provides that, if:

- an appointment of a proxy specifies the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution at a meeting of the Company's members; and
- the appointed proxy is not the chair of the meeting; and
- at the meeting, a poll is duly demanded on the resolution; and
- either of the following applies:
 - the proxy is not recorded as attending the meeting; or
 - the proxy does not vote on the resolution,

the chair of the meeting is taken, before voting on the resolution closes, to have been appointed as the proxy for the purposes of voting on the resolution at the meeting.

AGENDA

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

To receive and consider the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 31 December 2017 together with the declaration of the directors, the director's report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report as contained in the Company's annual financial report for the financial year ended 31 December 2017."

Note: the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

Voting Prohibition Statement:

A vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of either of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person (the **voter**) described above may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (a) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
 - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and
 - (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR CHRISTOPHER IAN WALLIN

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of clause 14.2 of the Constitution, ASX Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, Christopher Wallin, a Director, retires by rotation, and being eligible, is re-elected as a Director."

4. RESOLUTION 3 – ISSUE OF DIRECTOR OPTIONS – MR LAIF MCLOUGHLIN

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.11 and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve and authorise the Directors to issue up to 300,000 Director Options to Mr Laif McLoughlin (or his nominee) on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Memorandum."

Voting Exclusion: The Company will disregard any votes cast on this Resolution by Mr McLoughlin (and his nominee) and any of their associates. However, the Company need not disregard a vote if it is cast by a person as a proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with the directions on the Proxy Form, or, it is cast by the person chairing the meeting as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with a direction on the Proxy Form to vote as the proxy decides.

5. RESOLUTION 4 - SPILL RESOLUTION

If less than 25% of the votes cast on Resolution 1 are voted against adoption of the Remuneration Report, the Chair will withdraw Resolution 1.

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **conditional resolution**:

“That for the purposes of section 250V(1) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for:

- (a) a general meeting of the Company (Spill Meeting) be held within 90 days of the Annual General Meeting;*
- (b) all the Company’s Directors (other than the Managing Director of the Company) who are Directors of the Company when the resolution to make the Directors’ Report considered at the Annual General Meeting was passed (such directors being Mr Chris Wallin and Mr Jay Stephenson) cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting; and*
- (c) resolutions to appoint persons to office that will be vacated immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting pursuant to paragraph (b) above must be put to the vote at the Spill Meeting.”*

Voting Prohibition Statement:

A vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of any of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person (the voter) described above may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (c) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution; or
- (d) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
 - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and
 - (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

In accordance with the Constitution, the business of the Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 31 December 2017 together with the declaration of the directors, the directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's annual financial report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Company's annual financial report is available on its website at <http://www.stratmin.com.au>.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

2.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's annual general meeting, a resolution that the remuneration report be adopted must be put to the shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the company or the directors of the company.

The remuneration report sets out the company's remuneration arrangements for the directors and senior management of the company. The remuneration report is part of the directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the company for a financial year.

The chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the remuneration report at the annual general meeting.

2.2 Voting consequences

Under Corporations Act, a company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the directors of the company who were in office when the directors' report (as included in the company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the managing director of the company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as directors of the company is approved will be the directors of the company.

2.3 Previous voting results

At the Company's previous Annual General Meeting, the votes cast against the remuneration report considered at the Annual General Meeting were more than 25%. Accordingly, the Spill Resolution will be relevant for this Annual General Meeting if at least 25% of the votes cast on the remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report. Refer to Resolution 4 for further information.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR CHRISTOPHER WALLIN

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third AGM following the director's appointment or 3 year, whichever is the longer.

Clause 14.2 of the Constitution provides that at the Company's annual general meeting in every year, one-third of the Directors for the time being, or, if their number is not a multiple of 3, then the number nearest one-third (rounded upwards in case of doubt), shall retire from office, provided always that no Director except a Managing Director shall hold office for a period in excess of 3 years, or until the third annual general meeting following his or her appointment, whichever is the longer, without submitted himself for re-election. The Directors to retire at an annual general meeting are those who have been longest in office since their last election, but as between persons who become Directors on the same day, those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by drawing lots. A retiring Director is eligible for re-election. An election of Directors shall take place each year.

The Company has a requirement for three Directors and accordingly one must retire. Christopher Wallin, the Director longest in office since his last election, retires by rotation and seeks re-election.

Mr Wallin is a Fellow of the Australian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy, Fellow of the Australian Institute of Geoscientists and a Member of the Geological Society of Australia. He has 40 years' experience in the Queensland exploration and mining industry.

Mr Wallin is the Sole Director and owner of the QCoal Group which has managed the development and operation of numerous open-cut mines in Queensland and is currently overseeing the development of the Byerwen Coal Project. In 2014 QCoal's ongoing commitment to the industry was celebrated when the company was awarded the Queensland Miner of the Year Award.

In addition to exploration and mining QCoal is proud to be a principal sponsor of the Royal Flying Doctor Service Queensland.

Mr Wallin is the Sole Director of QGold Pty Ltd which is the major shareholder in Strategic Minerals Corporation NL.

4. RESOLUTIONS 3 – ISSUE OF DIRECTOR OPTIONS – MR LAIF MCLOUGHLIN

4.1 General

The Company has agreed, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval, to issue 300,000 Options (**Director Options**) to Mr Laif McLoughlin (or his nominee) on the terms and conditions set out below.

Resolution 3 seeks Shareholder approval for the grant of 300,000 Options (**Director Options**) to Mr McLoughlin (or his nominee) on the terms and conditions set out below. The Company previously received Shareholder approval for the issue of the Director Options to Mr McLoughlin at the annual general meeting held 30 May 2017 (**2017 AGM**) (Resolution 4) to provide a performance linked incentive component in Mr McLoughlin's remuneration package. However, due to an administrative oversight the Director Options were not issued within 1 month as required by the ASX Listing Rules. The purpose of this Resolution is to therefore reinstate the authority for the Company to issue the Director Options to Mr McLoughlin as previously approved at the 2017 AGM.

Listing Rule 10.11 requires shareholder approval to be obtained where an entity issues, or agrees to issue, securities to a related party, or a person whose relationship with the entity or a related party is, in ASX's opinion, such that approval should be obtained, unless an exception in ASX Listing Rule 10.12 applies. Approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 is not required in order to issue the Director Options as approval is being obtained under ASX Listing Rule 10.11.

The directors whom Director Options will be issued are a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director of the Company.

The Board (other than Mr McLoughlin) supports the grant of Director Options to Mr McLoughlin.

4.2 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

For a public company, or an entity that the public company controls, to give a financial benefit to a related party of the public company, the public company or entity must:

- (i) obtain the approval of the public company's members in the manner set out in sections 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (ii) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The grant of Director Options constitutes giving a financial benefit and Mr. McLoughlin is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director.

The Directors (other than Mr. McLoughlin who has a material personal interest in the Resolution) consider that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of the grant of Director Options because the agreement to grant the Director Options, reached as part of the remuneration package for Mr. McLoughlin, is considered reasonable remuneration in the circumstances and was negotiated on an arm's length basis.

4.3 ASX Listing Rule 10.11

ASX Listing Rule 10.11 also requires shareholder approval to be obtained where an entity issues, or agrees to issue, securities to a related party, or a person whose relationship with the entity or a related party is, in ASX's opinion, such that approval should be obtained unless an exception in ASX Listing Rule 10.12 applies.

As the grant of the Director Options involves the issue of securities to a related party of the Company, Shareholder approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 10.11 is required unless an exception applies. It is the view of the Directors that the exceptions set out in ASX Listing Rule 10.12 do not apply in the current circumstances.

4.4 Information required by Listing Rule 10.13

For the purposes of Listing Rule 10.13, information regarding the issue of Director Options is provided as follows:

- (a) The Director Options will be issued to Mr. McLoughlin or his nominee.
- (b) The maximum number of Director Options the Company can issue to Mr McLoughlin and/or his nominee under Resolutions 3 is 300,000 Director Options.
- (c) The Company will issue the Director Options to Mr McLoughlin or his nominee no later than one month after the Meeting (or such later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the Listing Rules) and it is anticipated the Director Options will be issued on one date.
- (d) The Director Options will be issued for nil cash consideration. Accordingly, no funds will be raised from the issue of the Director Options.
- (e) The Director Options will be exercisable at 145% of the 5 day VWAP, will expire 35 months from the date of issue and will otherwise be on the terms and conditions set out in Schedule 1.

Approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the grant of the Director Options as approval is being obtained under ASX Listing Rule 10.11. Accordingly, the grant of Director Options to Mr. McLoughlin (or his nominee) will not be included in the use of the Company's 15% annual placement capacity pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

5. RESOLUTION 4 – SPILL RESOLUTION

As set out above in the Explanatory Statement relating to Resolution 1, the Directors' Report for the year ended 31 December 2017 contains a Remuneration Report which sets out the policy for the remuneration of the Directors and executives of the Company. In accordance with Section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act the Company is required to present to its Shareholders the Remuneration Report as disclosed in the Company's 2017 Annual Report.

Under Corporations Act, if at least 25% of the votes cast are against the adoption of the 2016 Remuneration Report at the 2016 AGM, and then again at the 2017 AGM, the Company will be required to put this Resolution 4 to the AGM, to approve calling a general meeting (Spill Resolution).

At the Company's 2017 AGM, over 25% of the votes cast were against the adoption of the Remuneration Report. Accordingly, if the outcome of Resolution 1 in this Notice of Meeting is such that at least 25% of the votes cast are against the adoption of the Remuneration Report, the Company is required to put the Spill Resolution to the AGM.

If more than 50% of Shareholders vote in favour of the Spill Resolution, the Company must convene a general meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the AGM. All of the Directors who were in office when the Directors' Report was approved, other than the Managing Director (namely Messrs Wallin and Jay Stephenson) will (if this resolution is approved) need to stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting. Following the Spill Meeting, those persons whose election or re-election as Directors is approved will be the Directors of the Company.

If Mr Wallin is re-elected at this year's Annual General Meeting (Resolution 2), he will need to be re-elected at the Spill Meeting to remain in office after the Spill Meeting if Shareholders vote to move to a Spill Meeting if a "second strike" eventuated.

Shareholders may vote against the adoption of the Remuneration Report (Resolution 1), but may still vote against a Spill Meeting being held. If Resolution 4 is defeated, there will be no Board spill and the current Directors will remain and hold office in accordance with the Constitution of the Company.

As a public company is required to have minimum of three directors, the Corporations Act includes a mechanism to ensure that the Company will have at least three directors (including the Managing Director) after the Spill Meeting. If at the Spill Meeting, three directors are not appointed by ordinary resolution, the persons taken to be appointed are those with the highest percentage of votes favouring their appointment cast at the Spill Meeting on the resolution of their appointment (even if less than half the votes cast on the resolution were in favour of their appointment).

The Board believes the passing of Resolution 4 is not beneficial for the Company as it will create uncertainty as to the future of the Company and, in particular, the continued exploration expenditure on the Company's current assets.

Accordingly, the Directors believe that Resolution 4 is NOT in the best interests of the Company and unanimously recommend that Shareholders vote AGAINST this Resolution.

SCHEDULE 1 – TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF DIRECTOR OPTIONS

(a) Entitlement

Each Option entitles the holder to subscribe for one Share upon exercise of the Option.

(b) Exercise Price

Subject to paragraph 1(j) the amount payable upon exercise of each Option will be at 145% of the 5 day VWAP (**Exercise Price**).

(c) Expiry Date

Each Option will expire 35 months from the date of issue at 5.00pm (WST). An Option not exercised before the Expiry Date will automatically lapse on the Expiry Date.

(d) Exercise Period

The Options are exercisable at any time on or prior to the Expiry Date (**Exercise Period**).

(e) Notice of Exercise

The Options may be exercised during the Exercise Period by notice in writing to the Company in the manner specified on the Option certificate (**Notice of Exercise**) and payment of the Exercise Price for each Option being exercised in Australian currency by electronic funds transfer or other means of payment acceptable to the Company.

(f) Exercise Date

A Notice of Exercise is only effective on and from the later of the date of receipt of the Notice of Exercise and the date of receipt of the payment of the Exercise Price for each Option being exercised in cleared funds (**Exercise Date**).

(g) Timing of issue of Shares on exercise

Within 15 Business Days after the later of the following:

- (i) the Exercise Date; and
- (ii) when excluded information in respect to the Company (as defined in section 708A(7) of the Corporations Act) (if any) ceases to be excluded information,

but in any case no later than 20 Business Days after the Exercise Date, the Company will:

- (iii) allot and issue the number of Shares required under these terms and conditions in respect of the number of Options specified in the Notice of Exercise and for which cleared funds have been received by the Company;
- (iv) if required, give ASX a notice that complies with section 708A(5)(e) of the Corporations Act, or, if the Company is unable to issue such a notice, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors; and
- (v) if admitted to the official list of ASX at the time, apply for official quotation on ASX of Shares issued pursuant to the exercise of the Options.

If a notice delivered under 2(g)(iv) for any reason is not effective to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors, the Company must, no later than 20 Business Days after becoming aware of such notice being ineffective, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors.

(h) Shares issued on exercise

Shares issued on exercise of the Options rank equally with the then issued shares of the Company.

(i) Quotation of Shares issued on exercise

If admitted to the official list of ASX at the time, application will be made by the Company to ASX for quotation of the Shares issued upon the exercise of the Options.

(j) Reconstruction of capital

If at any time the issued capital of the Company is reconstructed, all rights of an Optionholder are to be changed in a manner consistent with the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules at the time of the reconstruction.

(k) Participation in new issues

There are no participation rights or entitlements inherent in the Options and holders will not be entitled to participate in new issues of capital offered to Shareholders during the currency of the Options without exercising the Options.

(l) Change in exercise price

An Option does not confer the right to a change in Exercise Price or a change in the number of underlying securities over which the Option can be exercised.

(m) Unquoted

The Company will not apply for quotation of the Options on ASX.

(n) Transferability

The Options are transferable subject to any restriction or escrow arrangements imposed by ASX or under applicable Australian securities laws.

ASIC means the Australian Securities & Investments Commission.

Board means the current board of directors of the Company.

Business Day means Monday to Friday inclusive, except New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and any other day that ASX declares is not a business day.

Chair means the chair of the Meeting.

Closely Related Party of a member of the Key Management Personnel means:

- (a) a spouse or child of the member;
- (b) a child of the member's spouse;
- (c) a dependent of the member or the member's spouse;
- (d) anyone else who is one of the member's family and may be expected to influence the member, or be influenced by the member, in the member's dealing with the entity;
- (e) a company the member controls; or
- (f) a person prescribed by the Corporations Regulations 2001 (Cth) for the purposes of the definition of 'closely related party' in the Corporations Act.

Company means Strategic Minerals Corporation NL (ACN 008 901 380).

Constitution means the Strategic Minerals Corporation NL constitution.

Corporations Act means the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth).

Directors means the current directors of the Company.
